Phase 1 - Senate Presidents Meeting

The Summit meeting started with a presentation of the topics provided by JCI HQ's and the European Senate National Presidents (there were no topics provided from the Senators yet). Jonathan Greco, EVP to Europe, explained the three requests in detail. After this, the attendees of the Summit divided into three equal teams according to the number of topics and each team worked on one topic. JCI HQs asked the ASE in 2017 to serve the organisation because of a need. The

- Help JCI Europe to find sponsors/partners/ mentoring
- Bring back business projects
- Helping to re-engaging membership in Europe

These topics were discussed between the Senate National Presidents at the Summit and taken further to be discussed with JCI National President of their countries. The aim is to find out their expectations from the Senate organisation.

Phase 2 – Mutual understanding on a NOM level between both Presidents

Thereafter, the topics from the Summit were discussed with the delegates from the Senate National Organisations. An update between the Senate representative of the individual countries and the National JCI President presented the recommendations. We then had an update of a general understanding of what the JCI organisation expects from the Senators. (I.e. Their needs and/or wants from us or maybe they need nothing at all.)

Note: Ambassadors provide and explain the topics to the Senate Presidents who could not attend the Summit.

Phase 3 – Discussions & Plan for action on the Senators side

At this stage, the recommendations have been confirmed between both parties. The Summit delegates were then able to have a detailed brainstorming session to come up with a plan of action. Part of that plan is that the Senators and Jaycees should stay in mutual contact with

each other and report back to the appropriate ASE Ambassador for them to collect the information and help determine the best practice so we can all plan ahead with more uniformity.

At the next Summit in 2018, ahead of the board meeting, all the National and Deputy Senate Chairman/Presidents will be invited. The results will be presented to them and the best practice shared, as they are our main target audience.

Phase 4 - Best practice exchange

At this stage, ASE Ambassadors are collecting the results of best practice and forward the information to the Best Practice Officer.
